What the Parish Council Do, Own or Maintain in Utterby

Reviewed and approved at the Parish Council meeting 7th March 2024

The Parish Council own and maintain in the village:

- 1. Four bus shelters
- 2. 2 Teak park benches on Village Green
- 3. 5 x Planters
- 4. Village Green including hedges / trees on village green
- 5. Millennium Oak Tree on Church Lane
- 6. Millennium Round Bench
- 7. Kissing gates on footpath entrance A16 / exit Church Lane
- 8. Village Sign on grass verge A16 corner Church Lane and two trees
- 9. Village Notice Board by Village Hall
- 10. Lockable cabinet The Parish Council has a cupboard in the Village Hall and in there store files in a locked cabinet.
- 11. Laptop, external hardrive The Parish Clerk keeps the Parish Council laptop, external hardrive and current files at her home base from where she works.
- 12. A mono laser printer

The Parish Council contracts:

- 1. Cleaning of bus shelters and telephone box monthly (all year)
- 2. Cutting of village green grass and hedges throughout the growing season
- 3. Monthly cutting of verges throughout the growing season
- 4. Any tree work required to Parish Council trees
- 5. Pest Control (moles) when required
- 6. Parish Clerk (contracted 4 hours per week)

The Parish Council administer/organise and pay for:

- 1. The Utterby Voice publication (twice a year)
- 2. The Parish Council website and Facebook page
- 3. The Annual Parish Meeting

The Parish Council paint/clean, but do not own or mechanically maintain:

1. The telephone box

Items the Parish Council do not own or maintain but do check periodically and report any issues to Lincolnshire County Council or East Lindsey District Council:

- 1. Wooden footbridge on public footpath
- 2. Traffic signs and traffic island
- 3. Potholes in road
- 4. Street lighting
- 5. Trees on the highway obscuring road signs or trees which are diseased/dying

Parish Council Liaison:

- The Parish Council are Consultees on all planning applications and TPOs and within the Utterby parish boundary and report observations and comments to East Lindsey District Council using their on-line web planning portal.
- 2. The Parish Council will liaise with the County Council, District Council, Louth Rural Police Team and relevant Agencies regarding issues within the village.
- 3. The Parish Council are members of LALC (Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils).
- 4. The Parish Clerk is a member of SLCC (Society of Local Council Clerks).

Councillors

- There are 7 Parish Councillor posts. None of the Parish Councillors receive any expenses for the work they perform as Councillors (except for mileage if attending an event away from the village).
- There are no separate committees.
- The village has a representative Lincolnshire County Council Councillor and East Lindsey District Councillor who, where possible, attend the Parish Council Meetings.
- The Council meet once a month (first Wednesday in month) except during August and January. A short Public Forum is held at the beginning of the meeting.
